Topic: Urban Issues and Challenges Part 1

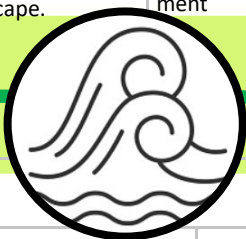
Focus: Investigate global impacts of urbanisations in a NEE as well as within the UK

Topic: Geopolitics

Focus: Explore how the physical world affects the development and Governance of a country and how it shapes the human world.

Topic: Population

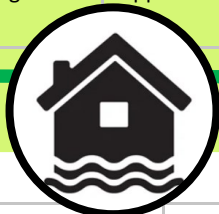
Focus: students will study population increases and decreases using specific local and global examples of these trends.

Focus: Students will explore Africa's biomes and cities, exploring the interrelationship between the physical and human world.

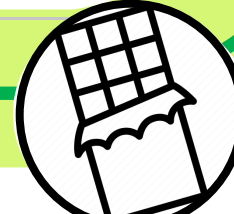
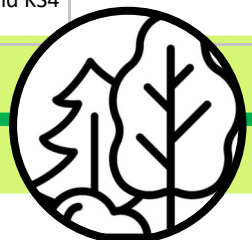
Topic: Chocolader enquiry unit
